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Chapter 24	Education Omnibus Budget Trailer Bill	<p>Education finance: education omnibus budget trailer bill – The items specific to early care and education items are as follows: maintains current reimbursement rates for early care and education (e.g. proposed 10% cuts successfully rejected); requires SPI to reimburse contracting agencies for certain state-subsidized childcare programs from July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021 due to the ongoing impacts of child care and development facility closures and low child attendance due to the COVID-19 pandemic and related public health directives if the program opens by 9/8/20, or within 21 calendar days from the start date of the contracting agency's 2020–21 program calendar approved the CDE or the program operated by the contracting agency is closed by a local or state public health order due to the COVID-19 pandemic; allows the state to backfill the costs of providing assistance to child care providers during the COVID-19 pandemic from 3/4/20-8/28/20 with federal CARES Act funds; appropriates \$198 million from the Federal Trust Fund to the SPI for COVID-19 pandemic-related relief and assistance for child care providers, the families those child care providers serve, and essential workers; establishes priorities and eligibility to meet child care needs by alternative payment programs as space is available; sweeps 2019-20 budget allocations for the Early Learning and Care Infrastructure Grant Program and the Early Learning and Care Workforce Development Grants Program and reverts funds to General Fund on 6/30/20; delays until 8/1/21 the deadline for a credentialed teacher first assigned to a transitional kindergarten (TK) classroom on or after 7/1/15 to meet the required criteria for teaching TK; transfers child care and development programs, except State Preschool, from the CDE to the CDSS and establishes the position of Deputy Director of Child Development within the CDSS to be appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate effective 7/1/21; and authorizes the CDE, during the 2020–21 school year, to waive provisions relating to an After School and Education Safety (ASES) program's hours of operation and pupil-to-staff ratio, and to waive the required funding adjustments for the ASES and High School ASSETs programs.</p> <p>CAAEYC CONTACT: JULIET PAILES</p>						SIGNED June 29, 2020
