Higher Education Institutes [HEI] statewide must continue to be innovative and identifying ways to meet the changing needs of the workforce while ECE educators providing for their own families. Higher education Institutes are up to the challenge however, they must have resources to transform how their courses which reflect the needs of today's professional. Some of those changes include zero cost textbooks, open educational resources, offering courses online as well as face to face and short-term courses is only to name a few.

The skills that I bring to this position is being creative and resourceful especially when the Association is experiencing fewer resources within the organization which is needed to expand membership.
